Visitation

Six hundred and nine visitors signed in during the month of March, 204 from 31 other states, 17 from eight foreign countries and 388 from Oklahoma. 53.9% were first time visitors. Only two days showed no sign-ins, inspite of the "interesting" weather we had during this month.

Visitors from Texas, Missouri, Kansas and California led the list of states, with Ireland the leader among the foreign countries with five visitors.

1998 totals show visitors from 35 states and twelve foreign countries.

The biggest prairie news is ---babies! Over 92 of them have been counted so far, and nearly 200 are expected this year! The bison are in many scattered bands, and are frequently visible from various places on the bison loop or the main road just after entering the bison range.

Spring burning is complete, and there have been no wild-fires on the preserve.

The new machine shop is about three quarters finished. Some weather delays have slowed this project.

The cowboys have been working on the Prairie Earth trail, as well as some fencing projects.

Turnout for the April 11 workday was slim. Some great volunteers worked very hard to pick up trash - but more volunteers are always needed in this area.
