Only 1182 visitors signed in during the month of July, the lowest July visitation recorded in the past five years. This number is down 9 percent from last July. (We wonder what part the weather played, and also if repeat visitors are actually signing in.)

28 visitors came from other countries, 496 came from other states and 658 came from Oklahoma.

Year-to-date figures show that we have had 6,340 visitors- 2150 from 48 other states and the District of Columbia, 3968 from Oklahoma, 4 from Puerto Rico, and 218 from 37 other countries.

45 percent of our visitors from other states come from six states: Texas, California, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois and Arkansas.

60 percent are first time visitors, according to the registration sheet.

- Estimates are that 200 calves were born this year. We'll know exactly after the roundup.
- There have been three control burns in the fire-bison unit during the past month, 120-acres and 150-acre plots were burned on Aug. 6, then a 300 acre plot was burned on Aug. 17. It was a hot day all around, as it was 102 degrees!
- Several of the older bulls are now staying out of the herd. The rest of the bison can be found in one or two large groups.
- Most of the calves born in 1998 have changed to their dark brown adult color.
- The May and July '98 issues of the <u>Journal of Range Management</u> have articles in them written by Bryan Coppedge regarding his bison research (conducted at the TGP for his Ph.D.)
- The new shop is complete. Renovation will soon begin on the old shop, turning it into the new gift shop and nature room.

- The cowboys have been replacing wire gates with steel gates on the west side of the Spring Trap. This is the area north of the Headquarters (720 acres) where the herd is held during round up. Steel gates will ensure that the herd does not escape back into the "wilderness".
- The prairie is very dry.

 There are lots of partridge pea and other legumes blooming, but not much is flowering now.
- Volunteer assistance is needed with trash pickup along the roads.

This past month, I met with Harvey, Brita and Ruth (state development director) to discuss long-range educational planning for the Preserve.

A large bit of our meeting time was spent discussing the new gift shop and nature room - an exciting change which will become a reality in the next six months!

We also discussed the drop in visitation which we have seen this summer, and whether this is a natural leveling out of visitation, or something we should address. We certainly see an increase in visitors when the Preserve has had state or national publicity. However, interest among Oklahomans due to speakers bureau and community events is constant.

Concern over our inability to get docent coverage of shifts in July and August was voiced. So was concern that we have lost some good gift shop coverage by using docents as trail guides for school groups.

My biggest concern continues to be that 25 percent of our docents have worked one or no shifts this season. All have been contacted by mail, and many by phone or voice message as well. Yet, this percentage does not change.

Volunteering as a tallgrass docent is a commitment to The Nature Conservancy and to your fellow docents. Please honor your commitment, or let us know if you need a hiatus!

Those of you who have been working have done as excellent job! Visitors are always positive about their docent contact, and your willingness to be flexible and provide good information to our visitors is terrific!

Remember that if visitors are interested in the interior of the headquarters, you are encouraged to open the door, step in with them, and let them look. All visitors should stay in the dining room, and observe the chains across the kitchen door and living room entry. When tours are being given, one docent should remain in the gift shop, or the shop should be locked. Never leave the shop unattended, or leave customers alone in the shop while you spend time in the office!
